REASON FOR THE WAR

- There were a combination of causes for World War I
 - Nationalism
 - Imperialism
 - Militarism
 - Alliances

NATIONALISM

- An intense devotion to the interests and culture of one's nation
- Created an atmosphere of competition and resentment



NEW COUNTRIES ON THE STAGE



- Germany and Italy were new countries in Europe
 - Germany created in 1871
- Slavic Nationalism or Pan-Slavism
 - They were fighting over territory in Austria-Hungary

IMPERIALISM

- Many European countries wanted to expand their empire.
- They fought over territory in Africa




MILITARISM

- Arms Race
 - Building of armies
- Naval Race
 - Building up of Navies
- Schlieffen Plan
 - Germany's plan of attack



ALLIANCES



Triple Alliance

- Britain, France, and Russia
- Triple Entente
 - Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy

THE SPARK THAT STARTS THE FIRE

- Archduke Franz Ferdinand, Austria's Prince, was assassinated in Sarajevo on June 28, 1914
- Killed by Gavrilo Princip, a Serbian nationalist





GOOD WILL TOUR

Franz and his wife, Sophie, had gone to Sarajevo on a good will tour. They hoped to quiet opposition to Austrian rule.

SERBIA AND THE BLACK HAND

- Princip was a member of a terrorist group called the Black Hand
- Wanted Bosnia to be part of Serbia
- Austria was mad at Serbia over the murder





THE DOMINOS FALL

- Germany pushed Austria to attack Serbia
- Russia stood up for Serbia by mobilizing along the border of Germany and Austria
- Germany declared war on Russia and France and invaded Belgium to get to Paris
- Great Britain declared war on Germany
- Russia declared war on Austria
- Italy and the Ottoman Empire jumped in by late 1914
